FLOWER POWER - May 2023 - Inspiration - spring flowers



This months block is a flower.

The triangles are cut 'improv' style.

You may refer to Diane's Block Lotto from March 2023 - Improv Spinners.

(Note - If you hate improv, I have added the 'snowball'


method at the end of this document as an option.)


Cut the following pieces:

- Four 5" flower squares Use floral, printed or plain fabric.
- Yellow four triangles. May be assorted scraps.
- White two 5" squares and eight white triangles.
- Green two strips 11/2" x 8" and one 1" x 5"

Free Style Flower Block:

- Lay one flower square, right side up on your table and place one yellow triangle on a corner. Audition to make sure it will cover the flower square after it is stitched.
- 2. Stitch. Press toward the corner, again making sure it fills the corner.
- 3. Repeat this process using two white triangles. These are stitched onto two of the corners of each flower. Position above the yellow as shown.
- 4. Note that there is space between the triangles. They do not overlap.
- 5. Repeat steps 1 4 on the other three flower squares. Make all four blocks with this same configuration.






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6. Press, making certain again that the triangles cover the original 5" flower square.



- 8. Trim off the excess flower fabric corners on the back side to reduce bulk and so the flower colour doesn't show through.
- 9. Stitch your blocks together like a four-patch. Each block is given a 90° clockwise turn and the yellow triangles are in the centre.
- 10. Press. The finished block is 91/2".



Leaf Block:

- 11. Lay one white square on your cutting mat. Cut a diagonal through from corner to corner.
- 12. Stitch a 1½ x 8" green strip to one of the diagonal sides. Stitch the other half to this strip, centering it carefully. This is one leaf block.
- 13. Repeat for the other leaf.
- 14. Press the seams toward the green leaf. Trim both squares 5". Position so they are a mirror image.
- 15. Stitch the stem, 1" by 5", between the two leaves. Press.
- 16. Stitch this leaf block to the lower edge of the flower block, making sure the stem is in a good position (You will have some wiggle room.)
- 17. Trim the finished block 91/2" by 14".



1 block = 1 ticket. Feel free to make a garden's worth.

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If you prefer not to do Improv, here is the snowball option

1. Traditional, snowball Flower Block:

- Cut four 5" squares. Options use florals, prints, plains, scraps or a Charm
 Pac. Any colour is okay think spring
- 3. Cut four yellow centres, each 2" square.
- 4. Cut 8 white, 2" squares.
- 5. Use the snowball technique. Press a diagonal through all the 2" squares.
- 6. Stitch along the crease one yellow square to a corner of each 5" floral print.
- 7. Stitch two white squares to each block as shown. Keep the configuration the same on all blocks.
- 8. Press each block so that the triangle folds toward the corner. Trim to original 5".
- 9. Trim off the excess corners on the wrong side to reduce bulk.
- 10. Stitch your blocks together like a four-patch, with the yellow centres aligned.
- 11. Press. The finished block is 91/2".
