
Log Cabin Variation

Guidelines - 1/4" seams

- press often
- You may 'free' cut with your cutting tool (be brave). (No ruler)
- Use cotton plains, prints, thrift store cotton. No batiks.
- It helps if you curate your potential fabric choices first.
- 1. Begin with an approximate 3" square in **<u>dark blue</u>**. (This colour will help unify the quilt blocks when assembled.)



- 2. Add strips to two sides, using a fabric that is a contrast to the blue. Follow the number sequence.
- 3. Continue adding strips to the same two sides. Try to add fabrics that are a contrast and a compliment to what went before in colour and in width.
- Continue using your cutting tool but not a ruler (the slight wonkiness makes it interesting), however, do use your keen eye to keep the widths of each set similar, and press often. (Note I used a ruler near the end of the process)
- 5. Keep going until you reach 121/2" square. Press and trim with a ruler.
- 1 block = 1 ticket
