
PUMPKIN PATCH.


Use your orange fabrics *(good quality fabrics).* Use white (Kona snow) for the edges.

Pumpkin:

- 1. Press and trim your orange fabric scraps.
- Stitch these together into a large block. It may be strips stitched together or more improv. (Hint - press often.)

Size of pumpkin - 9" - 11" before borders.









Snowball technique:

- 1. Cut four squares 2" each, of Kona white.
- 2. Mark the diagonal on each. Use a pencil or press a crease.
- 3. Position one square on each corner of your pumpkin and stitch on the diagonal line.
- 4. Press the seam toward the pumpkin and trim the excess behind to 1/4".

Borders and Stem:

- 1. Cut a strip of Kona white 2" wide and the length of pumpkin block. Cut this in half. Insert a 1" 1½" piece of brown stem. Press seams toward the stem.
- 2. Stitch this to the upper edge of the pumpkin block. Press and trim.
- 3. Add borders of Kona white to the other 2 or 3 sides. These should vary in width so the pumpkin is off centre. If your pumpkin is large, leave one side without a white strip. This way the finished quilt will have a more random 'pumpkin patch' look.
- 4. Press seams toward Pumpkin. Trim your block to the finished size of 121/2".

1 block = 1 ticket



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
