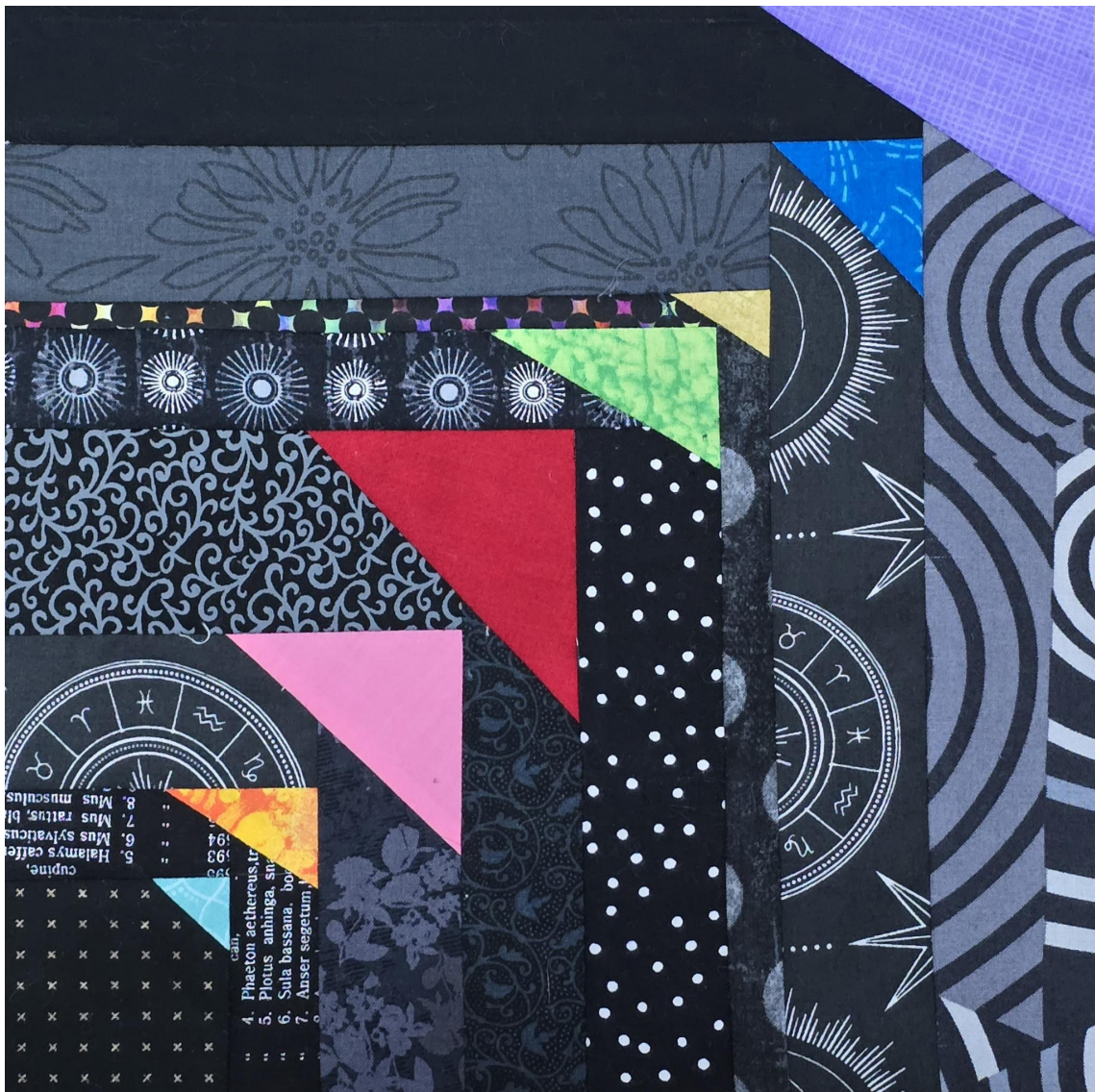


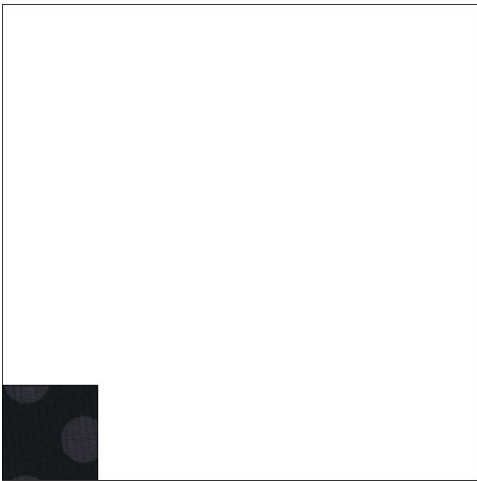

Rules of the game:

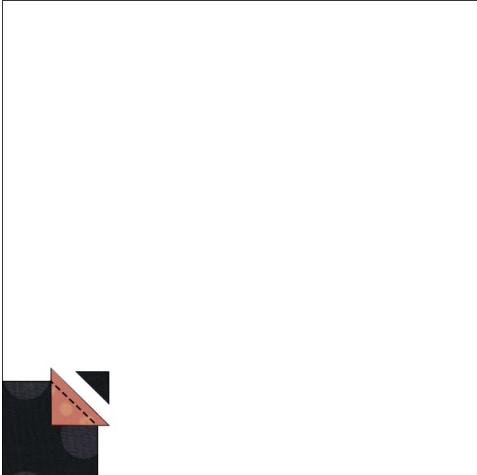
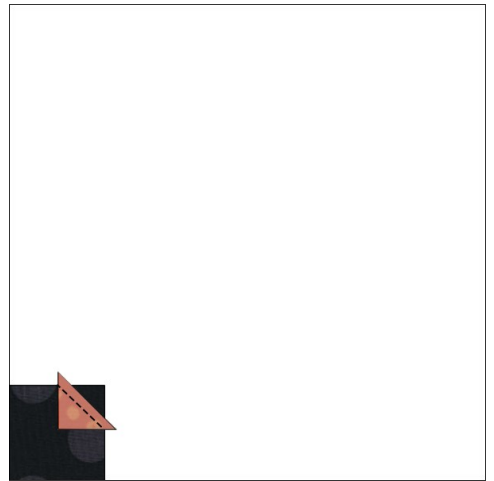
- Background fabrics should read black. Pick prints that won't overpower the flying geese.
- Triangles/geese should be bold bright colours to contrast with the blackish background.
- The strips should stay straight, but the geese can be wonky.
- Change up the width of the black strips for some variation.
- Float your points so that you don't clip the tips of previous geese.
- Use larger pieces for the geese than you think you need so that they don't end up too small when you flip and press.





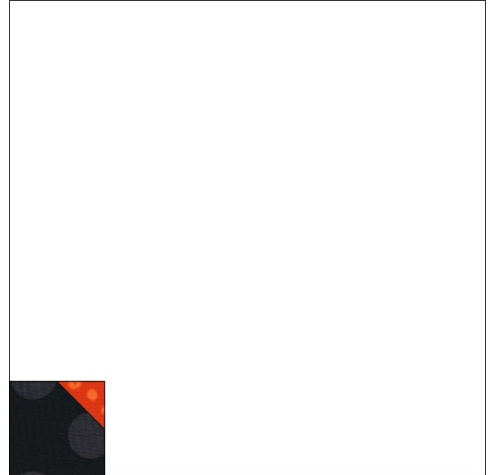
Start with a square.

Add a triangle to the corner and stitch down.



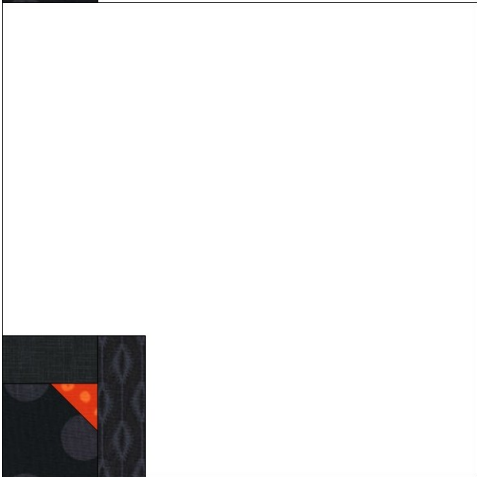
Trim excess of the square away.

Press triangle out and trim back to square.



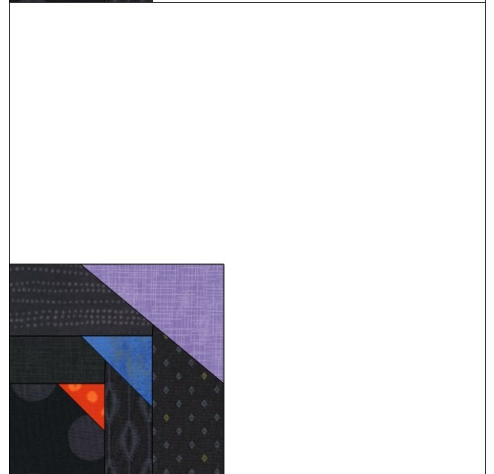
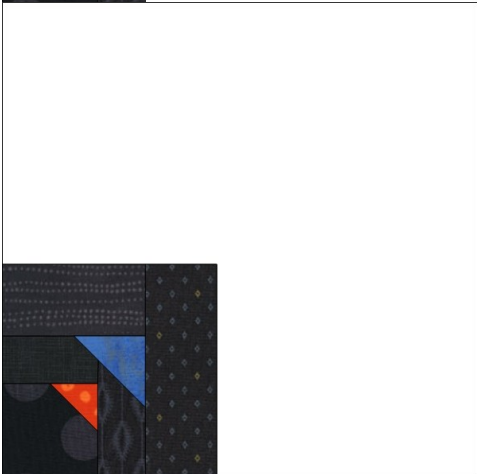
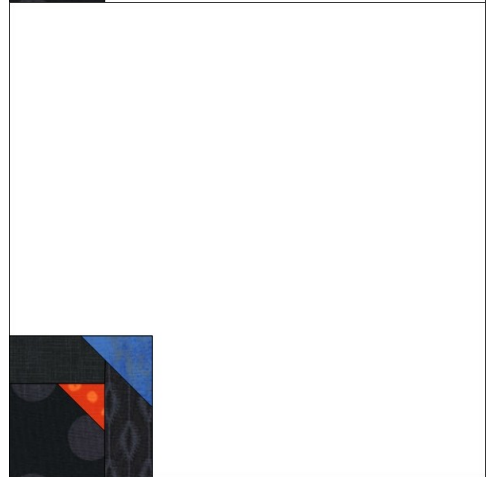
Add a strip to the top, then to the right side to form a new square.

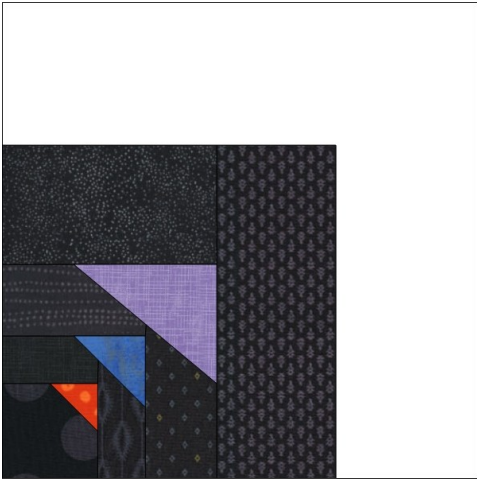
Repeat steps above to add a new triangle. Careful not to lose the tip of your previous triangle.



Add another strip to the top and to the side for an even larger square.

Add another triangle.

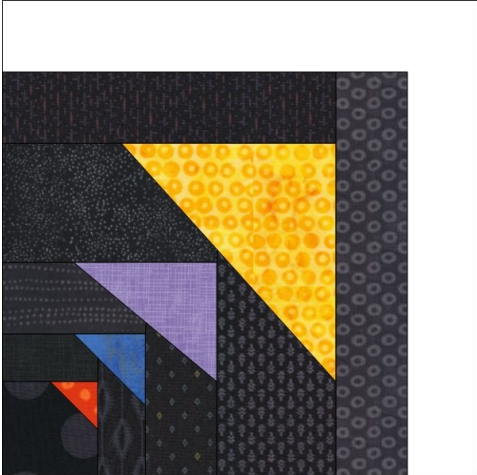




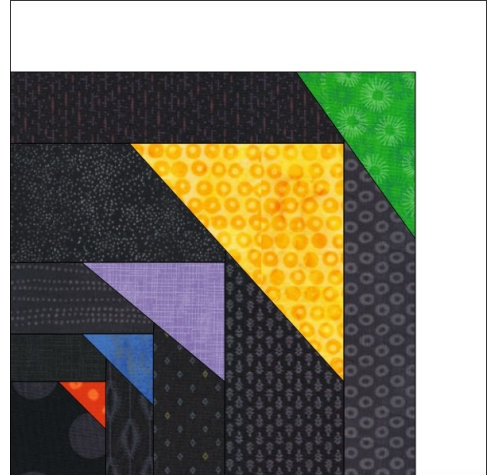
Continue in this manner.



Building up the square, then adding another triangle.



The triangles can be wonky.



But the squares should stay square.



The size of each set of strips doesn't matter. Change it up!



Keep going until your block measures 10.5" (for a 10" finished block).
